
Summer Events

Water Quality Results for 2004 from the Ministry of the Environment Lake Partner Program

Thanks to Fred Carter for testing Belmont Lake water. The average secchi disk reading for 2005 on Belmont Lake was the same as it has been for the last few years, at 4.7 metres (mesotrophic, moderately enriched) and 8 ug/l, total phosphorous. We may begin to see a difference in the secchi disk readings because of the zebra mussels.

The Bald Eagle

Early one Friday morning late in September last year, my nephew, Christopher Church, announced that he had been watching an unusually large bird sitting at the top of a tree by the edge of the lake. He could not identify the bird for sure, because it was about four or five hundred metres away, but he thought it might be a bald eagle. We both studied the bird through binoculars, and decided that a more positive identification could only be made by getting closer to the bird. We were able to motor slowly to within about 100 metres, and, just as we confirmed that this indeed was a bald eagle, the magnificent bird took off and flew, with his six-foot wingspan, to perch on a pine tree on Miner's Island, where we observed it for about fifteen minutes. I am sure this is by no means the only sighting of a bald eagle on Belmont Lake, but it certainly was for us, and what a special treat it was!

Bald Eagle ---- Haliaeetus Leucocephalus

• 32" in length

- 80" wing span [over 6 ft.!]
- diet consists mainly of fish, but will eat small mammals and other birds
- white upper neck and head
- white tail
- dark brown plumage
- yellow bill
- does not migrate great distances
- prefers wetlands and open water
- Distribution: The most concentrated populations may be found along the coastal regions of North America from Alaska to Washington on the west coast, and from Nova Scotia to Florida on the east coast. Small populations of low density may be found scattered throughout the continental U.S. and Canada, but they are very rare in our neck of the woods.

It pays to keep your eyes open at Belmont Lake. You never know what kind of a surprise the lake might serve up!

Lake Plan Report

The Lake Plan is moving at an accelerated speed now, and we are all very anxious for the completion of it. Here is an overview of where we have been and where we are going.

Our first official action was back in the spring of 2003 when we held a workshop in Havelock, for commercial operators. The attendees included representatives from various provincial and township government departments as well as local commercial business owners.

Shortly after that we sent out the Lake Plan Survey to all lake-front property owners. The response was more than we expected and the results were very supportive towards the Lake Plan.

The AGM last summer was primarily dedicated to our Lakefront Property Owners' workshop and was well attended by a very enthusiastic crowd. The feedback from both workshops has been overwhelmingly in favour of developing our own Belmont Lake Plan.

Most recently, Art Church, Randy French (French Planning) and I requested an informal meeting with the Township Council Members to share our actions

to date and our vision for the future. Most importantly, we wanted to include our council in every step we take as we are all partners in the preservation of Belmont Lake.

The meeting was attended by the Reeve Ron Gerow, Deputy Reeve Robert Watson, HBM CEO Dianne Hill and Councillors Martin, Preston and Sharpe, and was indeed casual, candid and extremely helpful for all. We, as cottagers, can feel comfortable in that we have a council that not only appreciates our concerns and interest in Belmont Lake, but more importantly, wants to work with us to complete this important task.

Next steps:

The Lake Plan committee members are each undertaking to write the various sections that make up our Lake Plan. Ultimately, this document will be approximately 70 pages including maps, graphs and text. At the time of this article, we are unable to determine when the final Lake Plan will be available; however, we are hopeful that the Lake Plan Executive Summary, will be completed this summer.

Once the full document is complete, it will be presented to our Township Council for consideration towards possible additions / amendments to The Official Plan. Our goal is to complete the Lake Plan by the fall 2005.

Invasive Species Alert!

As if we didn't have enough to contend with, such as zebra mussels, gypsy moths, and spiny water fleas, among others, it appears that there is yet another foreign invader poised at our shores. It is known as fanwort. Fanwort is a submerged aquatic plant native to South America. It has become very popular over the past few years as an aquarium plant because of its hardiness and tendency to reproduce at a terrific rate. It is these same qualities that make fanwort a less-than-desirable plant when introduced into a natural setting outside its normal range. Fanwort looks similar to some native Ontario aquatic plants, such as water marigold and white water-



crowfoot. Its main stem may grow up to 10 metres and the underwater fan shaped leaves are finely divided and arranged opposite each other along the main stem. The plant produces floating leaves and small white to pale yellow flowers with three petals and yellow centres.

Fanwort was discovered in

Kasshabog Lake in 1991. It has spread since then to North River and South Lake. (South Lake connects to Round Lake, and thus to Belmont Lake.) It is able to live in a variety of habitats: slow flowing waters, streams, small rivers, lakes, ponds and ditches. It prefers nutrient-rich shallow water. Although native to subtropical areas, fanwort is cold tolerant.

Once established, fanwort can form dense stands, displacing native vegetation and interfering with recreational uses, such as swimming and boating. Its long-term impact is not yet known.

You can help: Never empty the contents of your aquarium into any waterway. Not only is it illegal to do so in Ontario, but this is generally the most likely cause of infestation in lakes such as Kasshabog.

Since fragments of fanwort can grow into a fully functioning plant it can be spread between bodies of water on boats, in live wells and in outboard motor water systems. One should, therefore, take the same precautions when transporting a boat from lake to lake as one does for zebra mussels, namely, by removing any visible plants or mud from your boat, draining water from your motor, live well, bilge and transom wells while on dry land, rinsing your boat and equipment with hot tap water and drying your boat for at least 5 days before moving to another body of water.

Your BLCA has been meeting with representatives of the Ministry of Natural Resources, The Federal Department of Oceans and Fisheries, and the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters to discuss their plans for containing fanwort. These agencies are considering a number of strategies with respect to stopping the fanwort from spreading, and will be keeping our Association up to date on their progress. In the meantime BLCA will be undertaking a fanwort grid search on Belmont this summer to determine if the plant has taken hold in our lake.

A little Glimpse into the Past

We came to Marmora in 1951. Harold was in charge of clearing off the area where the mine would be developed. Lucy was seven and Rob nine. I was 30 and Harold 36 years). We came as Landed Immigrants, to be reviewed each year.

Harold wanted a cottage. We were lucky to meet Walter and Agnes Van Steenburg and became good friends. Roger Young had been showing us property for a possible cottage site. He took us to Walter's even though many had tried to buy from him and Walter was not selling.

Walter told us to pick out an area where we would like to build. We were to have a survey done. Access to the point would be through the field. Two gates were to be installed, the one at the road, kept locked, and one

between fields because Walter had cows.

It was a snowy day when we hiked out to the point. The two swamps were not frozen, so we had to jump from the logs and branches to the other side. Trees on the point were very thick and small. We brought the lumber we needed by boat from Archie Cummings bay. We built a toilet, picnic table and made forms for the cottage.

We were the only newcomers and got to be known as "The Johnny-Come-Latelies." There was one small cottage across the lake.

We hiked into the point until we built the road. We kept a small boat at what is now Heisey's to bypass the swamp.

It was a wonderful life. We had a sandy beach, excellent fishing and a boat. We used coal oil lamps for light and a cook stove for cooking. We drank the lake water, using halazone pills for safety, and ice from Roger Youngs for the ice box. This luxury living came after we built the cottage.

Archie Cumming had the fastest boat on the lake. He loved to ride the surfboard with him sitting on a chair. His brother, Jim, lived at the next cottage.

This was the start of forty-three years and counting on "Beautiful Belmont Lake."
